Combined Classes:

I want to remind parents once again about combined classes. It is reasonable to expect your child may be assigned to a combined class. Combined classes are created as a result of cap guidelines instituted by the Department of Education. These guidelines are a result of parental concerns and teacher concerns regarding the number of students in a P-6 class environment. We are mandated to keep numbers at 22 in P-2 and 27 for 3-6 classrooms. While it is of benefit to have lower numbers, combined classes are the resulting reality. We do try and consider how many times a child has been in a combined when creating class lists but sometimes it is unavoidable. **HOW WILL A COMBINED CLASS AFFECT MY CHILD?**

Several studies have found that students in combined classes do just as well as students in single-grade classes. In fact, some students actually do better in language and reading.
